- A. Accreditation Follow-up Report (5 minutes) Liana Koeppel and Phil Dykstra

- B. ASCCC Resolutions and the Cypress College Academic Senate (20 minutes) Craig Goralski

At the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges Fall Plenary Meeting, a number of resolutions that prompt action for local senates were passed. These resolutions will be presented and discussed, and the senate will be asked to explore strategies for implementing these resolutions at a local level.

- C. Curriculum Submission Practices (20 minutes) Craig Goralski and Silvie Grote

At the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges Fall Plenary Meeting, a breakout session entitled ‘Strengthening Processes within Local Academic Senates and Curriculum Committees’ highlighted the benefits of having standardized practices for the submission of curriculum at the departmental and division levels. Information and strategies from this breakout session will be shared with the senate and the senate will be asked to consider whether these strategies should be applied at Cypress College.

- D. Lab/Lecture Pay (10 minutes) Maha Afra

Faculty from the Kinesiology and Fine Arts divisions have expressed concern that the current negotiations between UF and the District will result in some lab units will be compensated at the same rate as lecture units, and others will not. Senate will be presented with a first draft of a resolution expressing senate support for all lab units being compensated at the same rate as lecture units.
