## Late-Start Classes Begin This Week

► Courses last 15- or 16-weeks and offer a post-Labor Day start date for parents.

More than 50 sections of classes begin this week, providing the opportunity for parents of school-age children the opportunity to take courses after the back-to-school rush.

The “late-start” courses also give students the chance to pick up a class after it’s too late to add a semester-length course.

Courses range from accounting to speech — many offer university credit for students planning to transfer to a four-year institution.

Late-start courses also give us a chance to build on the enrollment growth we’ve experienced during the last few semesters.

In fact, some divisions — such as Business/CIS — count on short-term courses for a significant portion of their enrollment.

In addition to this week’s courses, students can enroll in classes beginning the week of October 21. These “1/2-Semester” courses last just nine weeks.

Faculty and staff are asked to encourage students to consider these classes.

## State Eliminates Staff Development Travel Money

Are you thinking about traveling to a conference this year? As you probably already know, there are no staff development funds in the proposed state budget.

That means that no staff development monies will be available to faculty, classified staff, or managers for conference travel.

Of course, you may decide you want to attend a conference at your own expense.

In order to travel at your own expense during your contract hours and/or to be covered by district insurance while on college business, employees must obtain permission from their dean or their worksite supervisor — and ultimately the college president.

How do you obtain this permis-

sion?

1. Submit in writing or in an e-mail the following information to your dean or worksite supervisor: the name of the conference you wish to attend, the sponsoring organization, the dates of the conference including travel time, the location of the conference, and the reasons why you wish to attend. Please send your request at least three weeks in advance.

2. Your dean or supervisor will submit your request to Dr. Lewis in the form of a travel requisition and you will be notified if you have permission to attend the conference during regular contract hours.

If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your dean or work supervisor.

## Warning: Deal with Parking Citations Immediately

Cypress College Security took over responsibility for issuing parking citations on July 1. The change will help fund 24-hour security on the campus.

Taking over responsibility for issuing parking citations has provided the college with some additional flexibility.

However, some of the regulations are set by state law.

One of these requirements is that all fines are doubled if they are not paid — or contested — within 21 days.

That means that if your parking-pass hanger happens to fall from the mirror, waiting to make a visit to Security can be costly.

It's also a good idea to share this information with students.

Significant progress was made last week on the piazza-railing removal project.

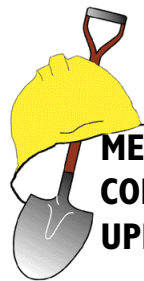
Crews worked quickly in the M&O area, opening the ground-level walkway on Thursday. On Monday, the pathway between the pool and TE1 was also opened, allowing pedestrian access on the lower level to the TE2 and TE3 buildings.

The area underneath the piazza adjacent to the A&R Annex on the pond-side of Lakeshore was closed on

Wednesday. It remained blocked off for railing removal as of the @Cypress publication deadline.

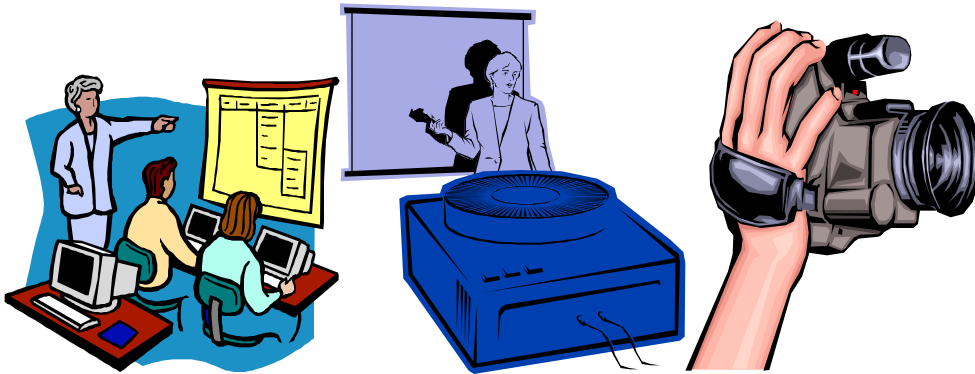

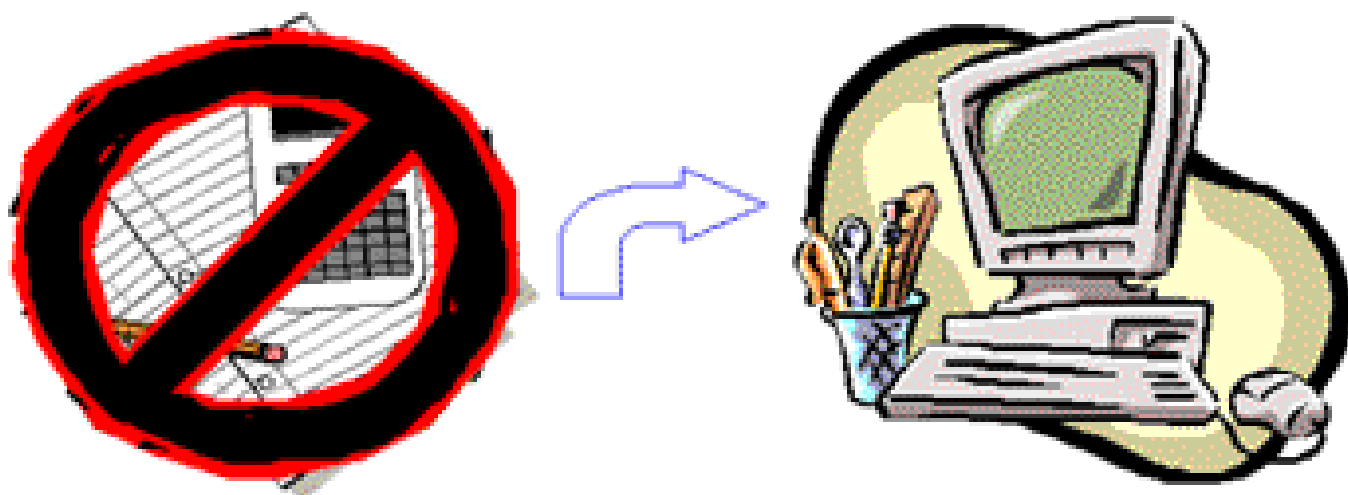
