Kishel has been at Cypress College since 1990 and is the coordinator of the Management and Marketing Department. Her classes include Introduction to Business, Small Business Management, Human Relations in Business, Principles of Selling, Consumer Behavior and Principles of Marketing.

Kishel received her MBA from Cal State Long Beach and bachelor's and master's degrees in Fine Arts from UCLA.

Prior to joining Cypress College she worked in television and taught in the Orange County area. She also founded a consulting firm with her husband, Greg, who is also a faculty member at Cypress College.

In addition to teaching, Kishel continues to manage her consulting firm part-time.

She and Greg have co-authored a number

of business books tailored for entrepreneurs and small businesses as well a novel, *Death on Parade*.

During her sabbatical leave she conducted research on multicultural marketing that will be published in a book.

Her goal and priority as an educator are to reach out to students of other disciplines

by building bridges in the campus community through the joint certificates program. She is committed to making her classes relevant and informative by relating her consulting and business experiences to her teaching. She then applies the feedback from the students back into her business. Her passion and love for teaching are fostered by her desire to share ideas and interact with the next generation. She is dedicated to helping students receive specialized training

in business.

She credits and thanks her husband, fellow colleagues and the campus at large for their continued support, help and contributions in her career.

Kishel was selected by a committee composed of students, faculty, and administration from a list of outstanding finalists who were nominated by their former or current students to be recognized for this award.

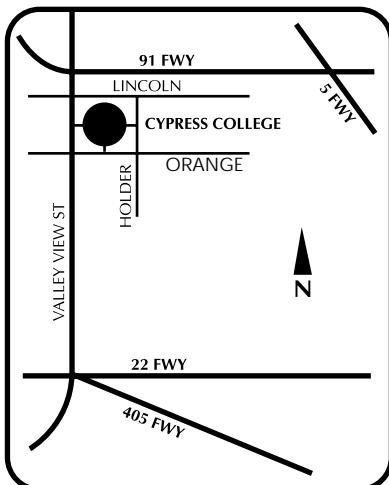

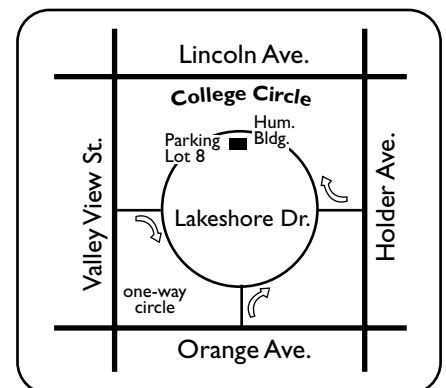
