Americana Kickoff

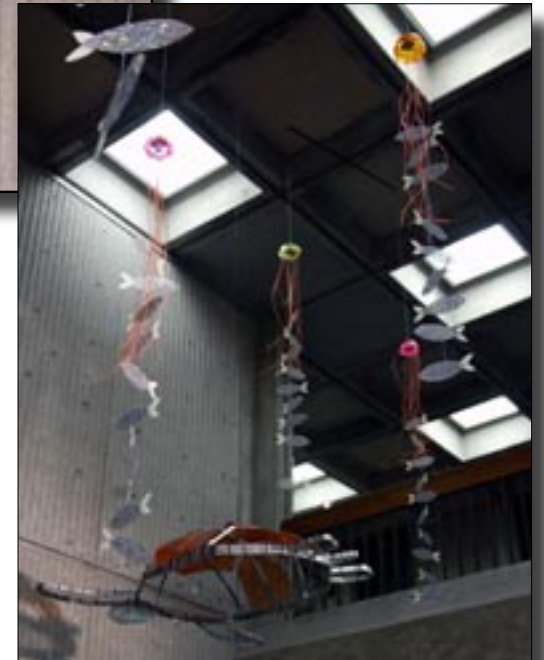

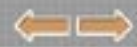

L/LRC Topping Off Ceremony

A "topping off" ceremony was held on Monday, November 15, 2004 to celebration the completion of the steel support structure for the new Library/Learning Resource Center. Employees, students and construction workers signed the final beam, which featured an evergreen tree and an American flag. All three are part of the "topping off" tradition, which celebrates placement of the final piece of steel in a new building. The tree and flag will eventually be removed, but the signatures are a permanent part of the new building.

Cypress College's L/LRC is the first new building on campus since the American bicentennial. Work is about halfway done on the two-story, 62,500-square-foot building, which will ben completed a year from now and opened at the start of the spring, 2006 semester.
