Cypress College Podcast Adds Student Co-Host this Semester

► **The internet-based, radio-style show is publishing more frequently this semester as part of the effort to tell our story.**

These days, it's difficult to cross campus without noticing a sea of students with cords dangling from earbuds to iPods.

With that in mind, the Cypress College Podcast is back on the virtual air this semester with student Ryan Ayres joining campus Public Information Officer Marc Posner as a co-host and an expanded production schedule.

The addition is intended to increase student listenership and provide a stronger link for listeners with campus events.

Wondering what a podcast is?

Quite simply it's an audio file, posted to the campus Web site. Listeners can subscribe so they automatically receive new editions right on their own computer.

Podcasting has risen to prominence in the past 18 months as the number of personal media players has grown. The ability to utilize iTunes software to manage podcasts was also significant in the development.

Interestingly, while the term "podcast" is a combination of the words "iPod" and "broadcast," neither is actually required. [The files can be played](#) on nearly any computer or personal media player.

Like @Cypress, the Cypress College Podcast is intended to help tell the college's story.

Episodes generally feature a news segment and an interview with a student, alum, employee or someone connected to the campus.

7% Increase in Degrees and Certificates

A total of 779 degrees and 553 certificates were awarded in 2006-2007, according to data compiled by the Office of Institutional Research. Those figures represent an almost 7% increase in the total number of awards compared to last year. Areas that saw the most growth in degrees were: Liberal Studies, Nursing, Mortuary Science, and Business. Disciplines that experienced the most growth in certificates awarded include Hotel, Restaurant and Culinary Arts, and Marketing.


