Walter K. Bowman Selected as Cypress College's Alumnus of the Year

► **The sole owner of Bowman Real Estate has a long history of community involvement, including here at the college.**

Walter K. Bowman's list of successes as a real estate broker is impressive. It is a career that began at Cypress College with an associate's degree in business administration.

Based on his accomplishments and his service in the community, the Foundation has selected Bowman as the Outstanding Alumnus for 2006.

“The committee, including 3 retirees and a past recipient of the award, all rated him at the very top of their list,” said Raúl Alvarez, executive director of the Foundation and Community Relations. “Of course, this kind of selection is extremely tough, since all the candidates are so strong, and comparing them often turns into an ‘apples-to-oranges’ discussion.”

Bowman was “thrilled and humbled” when he learned of the award that he will accept at graduation on Wednesday, May 24.

Bowman has been a licensed real estate broker since 1974, the same year he launched his own business, Bowman Real Estate, offering

sales, management, leasing and development of commercial, industrial and residential property. He first opened an office in Stanton, followed by a location in Cypress.

Bowman's love for his community is seen in the many ways he has served the city of Cypress through the years. He was mayor in 1991 and in 1996, and was a city councilman from 1989-98. Bowman is also a member of the Cypress College Foundation Board, currently serving as president, and is a director for the Cypress Chamber of Commerce, which named him “Man of the Year” for 2000. He also enjoys being a member of the choir at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Cypress.

He was the Americana Citizen of the Year from Cypress in 2002 and previously served as president of the Cypress College Patrons of the Arts. Besides his decade of city council work, Bowman is a former board member of the Cypress Boys and Girls Club, former chairman of the Orange County Housing Commission and has been a member of Kiwanis for more than 30 years. Also active in the community next door, Bowman has served as president of the Stanton Chamber of Commerce, the Stanton Boys and Girls Club, and the Kiwanis Club.

In addition to his associate's degree, he earned a bachelor's degree in Finance from Cal State Long Beach. He also served in the U.S. Army for three years.

Golf Records Fall as Men's Team Shines

Records are meant to be broken. The men's golf team set a school record on March 27, shooting a combined 358 against Irvine Valley. The team followed that record-breaking performance with another on April 3, shooting a 354 against Santa Ana College. All of Cypress's five counted scores were at or below par to combine for a team score that was 6 under par, a phenomenal achievement. Cypress improved to 10-2. The Chargers are coached by Counselor Dana Bedard.
