**RESTRICTIONS:**

- **Students still in high school:** College courses taken *before high school* graduation can be used to fulfill any of the requirements listed below except for the writing requirement, global perspectives, or the foreign language requirement. Courses taught in a high school setting, even if they are transcribed by a college or university do NOT earn credit at USC.
- **USC STUDENTS:** Once you have enrolled at USC, *you cannot take transfer courses to fulfill GE or the writing requirement.* Only with a completed pre-approval form from USC, you may take transfer courses in the summer to fulfill global perspectives or language, obtain equivalence, or elective units.
