### Spring Graduation Application Deadline Has Moved

Admissions and Records has moved the application deadline for spring graduation to November 30th. This is approximately two and one half months earlier that it was last year. The reason it has been moved is to give the evaluators more time to review applications for the Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT).

This deadline is especially important for students who will complete their ADT in Spring 2016. In order to receive the benefits of the ADT it has to be verified. According to Karen Simpson-Alisca from the California State University (CSU) Chancellor's Office,

"...there are three levels of verification in the ADT process. The first is the students self-reporting on their CSU Mentor application that they have already earned or in progress of completing an AA-T or AS-T degree. The second is the eVerify process and the third and final verification is receipt of the students final transcripts with the ADT degree posted."

Cypress College participates in the eVerify system. This is an online system that the evaluators use to indicate that a student has earned or is on track to earn an ADT. If students miss the graduation application date, the evaluators do not know to review their transcripts and their degrees will not be posted on their final transcript which is due July 15th. Students can still apply to graduate in summer but the degree will not be posted until August which may be too late for some universities. The ADT gives students some priority for entrance into the university and guarantees students entrance into the CSU system. If the final verification is missing, universities may rescind their offers of admission.



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### Important Dates

#### UC Application:

The application website is open from August 1st to November 30<sup>th</sup>. You can submit our application beginning November 1<sup>st</sup>.

**CSU Application:** The application website opens on October 1<sup>st</sup>. The priority submission time is October 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>. After November 30<sup>th</sup> some schools or specific programs within a school may close for applications. Send transcripts after fall grades are posted.

**UC Application Update:** You must update your application as soon as your fall semester grades are on your transcript. The deadline date will be sent to you by email.

#### Independent Colleges and Universities:

Deadlines vary. See individual school website for dates.

**Financial Aid:** Submit your FAFSA between January 2<sup>nd</sup> and March 3<sup>rd</sup>.

**Student Intent to Register (SIR):** June 1<sup>st</sup> or one month after acceptance letter is sent if later than May 1<sup>st</sup>. An exception is San Diego State University where the SIR is due May 1<sup>st</sup>.

## Transfer Applications Due

October 1<sup>st</sup> through November 30<sup>th</sup> is the priority period for submitting applications to the California State University (CSU). November 1<sup>st</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> is the priority period for submitting to the University of California (UC). This means that all applications submitted during this period will be reviewed. After this time, the universities can stop accepting applications if they have reached their target numbers. They may stop accepting all applications or stop accepting applications for specific majors while remaining open for other majors.

Both university systems require students to complete and submit their applications online. The CSU application website is located at [www.csumentor.edu](http://www.csumentor.edu). The UC application is at [www.univeristyofcalifornia.edu/apply](http://www.univeristyofcalifornia.edu/apply). Both sites have instructions and tips for completing the applications. Both also have application status pages that give students information about open and closed majors as well as open and closed campuses.

## Workshops for Future Law Students

The Transfer Center has partnered with Trinity Law School to present a Law School Series of workshops. The first one will be held on November 3rd at 1:30 PM in the Cypress College Complex room 419.

This first presentation will be on the Law School Admissions Test (LSAT). The LSAT is the first step for admissions for those interested in law school, but preparing for it can be daunting. ## Walk-In Application Help

The Transfer Center is offering walk-in application help. Counseling interns are available to assist students with all parts of the CSU and UC applications.

In addition, students can request a transferable GPA computation. Students need to provide an unofficial copy of their transcripts from all schools attended since high school and complete the Cal State University Transfer Application Worksheet. They will be notified when the form is completed and ready for pick up.

## Transfer Guarantee to HBCUs

The Transfer Center is excited to inform you about the new California Community College (CCC) transfer pathway program to Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) sponsored by a grant from the CCC Chancellor's Office. CCC students can now transfer to any one of our nine HBCU partners by obtaining an Associate Degree for Transfer or 30 or more UC or CSU transferable units with a 2.5 or higher GPA. Additional details regarding the program are available at [www.cccco.edu/hbcutransfer](http://www.cccco.edu/hbcutransfer).

The nine HBCU partners at this time are Bennet College, Dillard University, Fisk University, Lincoln University Missouri, Philander Smith College, Stillman College, Talladega College, Tuskegee University and Wiley College. Students wishing to apply to non-partner HBCUs should use the Common Black College Application. There are 104 HBCUs that use this application. If a school is not on the application, the student will need to go directly to the HBCU's website to apply.

Interested students should meet with a counselor to determine if they are transfer ready and meet the criteria above. Many schools are still accepting applications for the spring semester. A fee waiver code that waives the application fee is available from the counselors or the Transfer Center.
